-Worsted Weight Yarn

- Light Blue
- Brown
- Dark Blue
- Sand • Random Color

-Buttercream from Luxe Craft

- Brown

-Small amount of stuffing

-Safety Bead Eyes (optional)

-Pipe Cleaner

*Not included in Club Crochet kit:*

-Needle

-Size G6 4.00mm Hook

## Abbreviations

-Sc : Single Crochet

-Dec/Inc : Decrease/Increase

-InvDec : Invisible Decrease

-FLO/BLO :Front/Back loops only

-Bo : Bobble stitch

-St : Stitch or stitches

Gauge : 5 Rnds and 4 sts per 1"

Finished piece is about 2" tall

Worked in the round

# Making eyes

After choosing your yarn you can get a rough estimate on how you want to make your eyes. There are two main options for eyes when making your amigurumi.

Using solid bead eyes (red above):

These are solid plastic beads that you snap onto your product before closing up. You can usually find these at craft stores like Joann's or Michaels.

In the image on the right, the triceratops made with Lion Brand Vanna's Choice (left) uses a size 8mm eye, whereas the one made with Lily Sugar n' Creme (right) uses a size 6mm. Make sure to be weary of the size of your yarn and the size of the eyes.



Using Bullion Knots (blue above):

Another method is using yarn and a needle and making bullion knots. This is a pretty easy method and really useful if you can't find the beads, or the area is too small for the beads.

## Choosing a yarn

Before making our mini we have to think about what kind of yarn we want to use! Check out these two triceratops made with two different kinds of yarn:



The one on the left is made with Lion Brand Vanna's Choice, a weight category of 4 and a size 19/5.50mm crochet hook, and the one on the right is made with Lily Sugar n' Creme, with a weight category of 3 and a size G6/4.00mm crochet hook.

Keep in mind the size of your yarn and crochet hook when making amigurumi. Too big of a yarn / hook and you could be left with holes making it tough to stuff, too small of a yarn / hook and the pattern might be too difficult to complete!

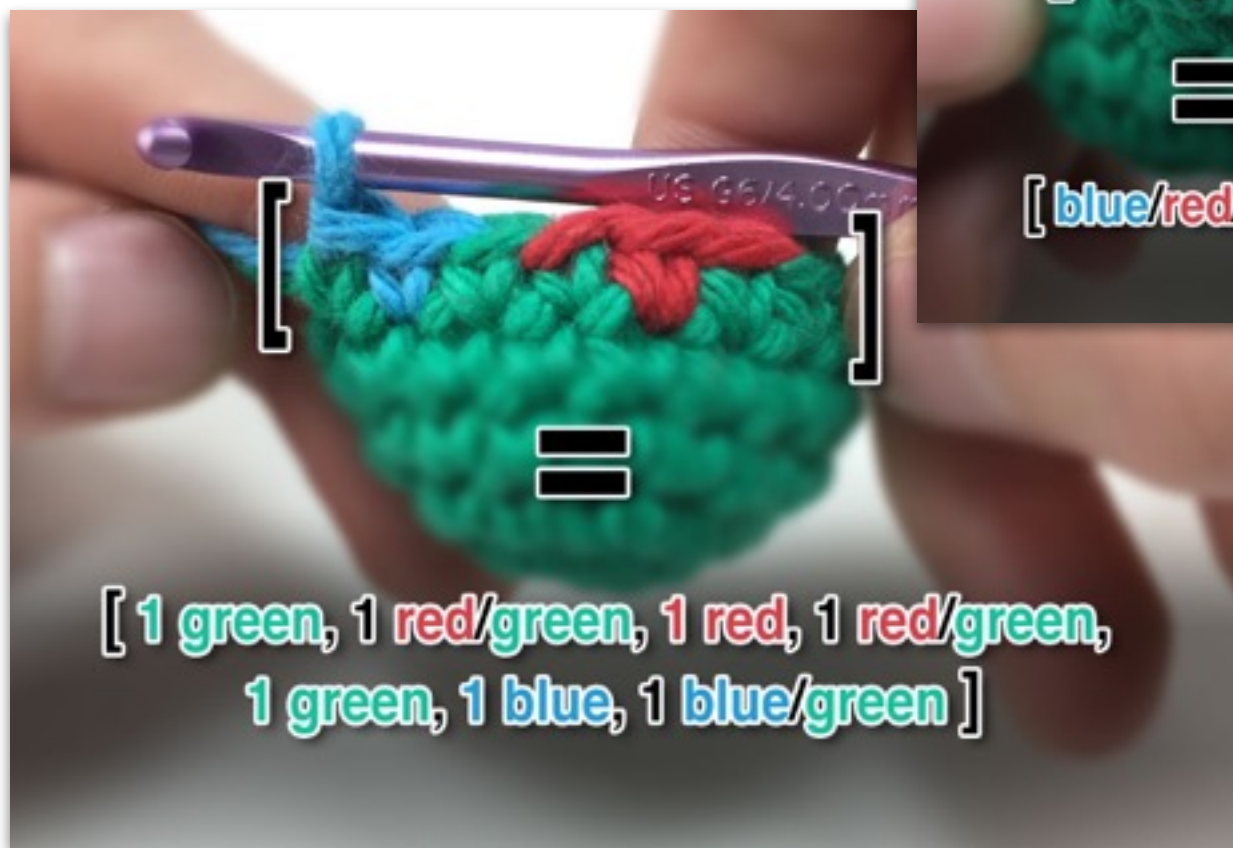
# Color Changes

[See video 1]

Note: This pattern requires a few of color changes. Be sure to check the end of each Rnd before continuing through the round to know when to change colors. Be sure to carry colors required for each round along with you before you need to do a color change.

For color changes with color/color (ex: 1 red/green), pull through the first with the first color (red), and next with the second color (green).

# Head

[Starting in **Brown**]

Ch 2 (or use magic hoop method)

Rnd 1: Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook or into magic hoop (6)

Rnd 2: inc (sc 2) in each st around (12)

Rnd 3: [sc, inc] repeat 6 times (18)

Rnd 4: [sc 5, inc] repeat 3 times (21)

Rnd 5: sc in each st (21)

Rnd 6: sc in each st (21)

Rnd 7: [sc 5, invdec] repeat 3 times (18)

- Color changes start here -

Rnd 8: sc in each st (18) [6 Sand, 12 Fuzzy Brown]

Rnd 9: sc in each st (18) [7 Sand, 10 Fuzzy Brown, 1 Sand]

Rnd 10: sc in each st (18) [All Sand]

Rnd 11: sc in each st (18) [3 L Blue/Sand, 2 Sand, 13 L Blue/Sand]

Rnd 12: Working in BLO sc 3, both loops sc 3, Working in BLO sc 12 (18)  
[4 L Blue, 1 Sand, 13 L Blue]



## Extra parts

Add the eyes using safety beads or bullion knots (See Page 2).

Add a beard and mustache using a strand of the Fuzzy Brown yarn that we used for the hair.

For the paint brush I used a pipe cleaner and some light purple yarn that I then wrapped around in brown yarn so that the purple yarn just stuck out at the top. Then I sewed it onto the hand.

You can also try using a toothpick that you could paint (or color with a marker). Be creative!



# Body

[See video 5 for hands]

Rnd 13: bo [in L Blue/Sand/Sand], sc 7, bo [in L Blue/Sand/Sand], sc 9 (18)

[1 L Blue/Sand/Sand (bo), 7 L Blue, 1 L Blue/Sand/Sand (bo), 9 L Blue]

Rnd 14: sc in each st (18) [All Black/L Blue]

Rnd 15: sc 2, bo [in Blue/Brown/Brown], sc 4, bo [in Blue/Brown/Brown], sc 10 (18)

[2 Blue, 1 Blue/Brown/Brown (bo), 4 Blue, 1 Blue/Brown/Brown (bo), 10 Blue]

Rnd 16: [sc, dec] repeat 6 times (12) [All Blue]

Rnd 17: dec in each st (6) [All Blue]

Cut and stuff together [See video 2]
